Tena Koutou. Welcome back to term 4. What a crazy year it has been! We can not wait to have our students back in the classroom in what will be a very busy, nine week term.

Theme

Our theme this term is looking at Change. We will be exploring this topic in a variety of ways throughout the term. These include how change is created within a country (Politics), how states of matter change, and how technology has changed over time.

Te Reo

The tamariki will be revisiting their pepeha created in Term 1 and gaining a deeper understanding of this. They will build their knowledge of Te Reo Māori by engaging in language games and waiata guided by the expertise of our kapa haka leader, Whaea Wharekuka.

Mathematics

The teachers will continue to work towards the next steps in number strategies for each student. We will also focus on Statistics as a strand, which includes reading and interpreting data and graphs, working out the probability of certain things and carrying out our own statistical investigation.

Reading

There will be a focus on developing decoding and comprehension strategies through a range of fiction and non-fiction texts.

Writing

The children will begin the term writing a speech around a topic of their interests. These will be based around the structure of PIE (Persuade, Inform, Entertain). Students will be exposed to a range of genres and learn about the key language features required to create purposeful pieces of writing.

Swimming

We are very lucky to be able to offer class swimming sessions from week six, leading into our swimming sports day on the Friday of week nine. We have limited sets of goggles at school. Please ensure your child has the appropriate equipment to participate in these sessions. We will not ring home for forgotten swimming items.
