This term, we continue on the School Lunch Programme. Should you find that this is not working for you or your child, please let your classroom teacher and the office know so that they can be removed from this programme.

We are excited to be back at school for Term One. We have an action packed term and the teachers are excited to get it under way.

#### What's on?

**Theme** – We will be learning about belonging to a group and our responsibilities within a group. We will learn about Waitangi Day. We will investigate computers and what they do.

Maths – Our focus continues to be developing number knowledge and strategies. We will also look at measurement - specifically length. Basic Facts will be in our daily routine. To help your child at home please check out the Junior Numeracy Challenges. These can be found in their Home Learning books.

Writing – The children are continuing to generate writing from their own personal thoughts, feelings and from language experience activities. We encourage parents to please discuss any experiences you may have out and about. This will enhance your child's oral language. You are welcome to call into class and read their amazing work.

The Arts – We are creating a range of artworks to enhance our rooms. This term, these will be focused on our themes - All About Me, Belonging to a Group and Waitangi Day.

P.E – We will be working on daily fitness activities and a unit on Play Based P.E.

**Te Reo** – Daily greetings, mihi, karakia and waiata continue to be an ongoing focus. We will also be learning about the Treaty of Waitangi.

Play Based learning will be incorporated into all our Junior Classes.

## What does Play Based learning look like;



Literacy and numeracy are fundamental aspects of our Junior Programme. Opportunities to use literacy and numeracy skills occur naturally through play and we also have daily explicit teaching time. During play, the teacher may be teaching individuals or small groups (literacy and numeracy) or will be acting as a facilitator to support the skills or focus that the students are exploring. Children choose their own play activities, using materials and resources that are in or outside the classroom. Many activities expand into more in-depth learning.

#### HOME LEARNING

Home Learning books will begin to come home by Week Three. There is a brief explanation at the beginning of the book outlining our syndicate expectations.

Books will contain a reading log, sight words, spelling words, basic facts and a hundreds board. A new poem is also added each week.

We do ask that parents support the class teacher by ensuring book bags and home learning books come to school daily.
